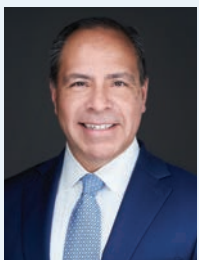

Climate Statement

Main Line Health is committed to improving human health through environmental stewardship, recognizing the growing impact of climate change on public well-being. As a healthcare provider, we’re implementing strategies to:

Main Line Health has joined more than 140 organizations representing 943 countries in signing the Health Sector Climate Pledge. By signing the pledge, Main Line Health commits that it will halve emissions by 2030 from a post-2008 baseline, reach net zero by 2050, appoint an emissions reduction executive, complete a Scope 3 inventory of indirect emissions by 2024 and release a climate resilience plan addressing vulnerable community needs.

This bold initiative not only aligns with our existing sustainability goals but also strengthens our commitment to creating a future of thriving human and environmental health. We will continue to work arduously to meet these targets because they are crucial guideposts in our ongoing sustainability journey.

- **Main Line has several objectives for fiscal year 2025:**
 - **Emissions:** Develop a climate resiliency plan and conduct Scope 3 emissions survey. Reduce emissions by 50% by 2030.
 - **Electricity:** Reduce energy use index by 1% at five hospitals, and by 1.36% at Mirmont Treatment Center (showing progress from 2023 baseline)

- **Water:** Reduce water use index by 1% at five hospitals, and by 2% at Paoli Hospital (accounting for normalized usage after sprinkler tank fix)

4. Drive Strategic Growth and Deliver Outstanding Value

Main Line Health Sustainability Strategic Roadmap

Main Line Health's inaugural sustainability roadmap has been instrumental in initiating and shaping our environmental stewardship efforts. This strategic framework has been pivotal in transforming abstract environmental concepts into tangible, organization-wide practices, laying the groundwork for our ongoing commitment to environmental responsibility. The current roadmap is now drawing to a close.

Our new roadmap will be strategically aligned with our Climate Pledge, emphasizing stringent carbon reduction requirements. This alignment underscores our commitment to meaningful environmental action and positions Main Line Health as a healthcare sustainability leader. We will focus on the following:

- Setting science-aligned targets for greenhouse gas emissions reduction

- Exploring cost-effective carbon reduction opportunities
- Implementing innovative energy efficiency measures
- Transitioning to renewable energy sources where feasible
- Investing in sustainable healthcare technologies and practices

Through this process, we are not just creating a roadmap. We are crafting a transformative vision that will guide Main Line Health's sustainability efforts for years to come and our commitment to the health of our patients, communities and the planet.

Priority Goals and Targets FY2025

Main Line Health joined nearly 140 organizations in signing on to the Health Sector Climate Pledge, aiming to cut greenhouse gas emissions by 50% by 2030 and achieve net-zero emissions by 2050.

CLIMATE PLEDGE

Over 130 organizations have already joined the Health Sector Climate Pledge. The pledge aims to cut greenhouse gas emissions by 50% by 2030 and achieve net-zero emissions by 2050. Signees annually must publicly account for progress on emissions reduction, assign an executive-level lead, conduct a Scope 3 indirect emissions inventory and develop a climate resilience plan for continuous operations. Despite the Health and Human Services Climate office ceasing operations, Main Line Health remains dedicated to fulfilling the Climate Pledge, underscoring its commitment to the community.

Climate Resilience Plan:

- In 2024, Main Line Health proactively conducted a comprehensive Climate Risk Assessment. This strategic initiative focused on enhancing the resilience of our facilities across all Main Line Health sites, preparing us for potential climate-related challenges. In addition, a series of interactive workshops were conducted, engaging diverse stakeholders to gather valuable insights and perspectives.
- Moreover, this Climate Risk Assessment serves a dual purpose. Beyond bolstering our resilience, it aligns Main Line Health more closely with the commitments outlined in the Health Sector Pledge. This alignment demonstrates our ongoing dedication to environmental stewardship and positions us as a leader in sustainable healthcare practices.

Scope 3 Inventory (Indirect Emissions)

In parallel, Main Line Health conducted a comprehensive Scope 3 emissions inventory, using spend-based methodology, including from our supply chain, employee commuting and waste. We found that 46% of our emissions were Scope 3, mostly coming from construction and development projects.

Lankenau Earns Sustainability Award

Practice Greenhealth is the leading organization advancing sustainability within the healthcare sector. The organization partners with its member hospitals, health systems, healthcare value chain organizations, among other big healthcare industry players, to offer crucial sustainability expertise as members continue on their sustainability journeys. Each year, Practice Greenhealth grants awards to hospitals and hospital systems with distinct achievements in progressing sustainability.

In 2025, Main Line Health successfully achieved the Partner for Change Award for Lankenau Medical Center, reflecting our commitment to implementing environmentally responsible practices and innovative sustainability initiatives.

This recognition validates our approach to environmental stewardship and positions us as an emerging leader in healthcare sustainability, motivating us to accelerate efforts toward our sustainability goals and expand our environmental impact in our communities.

Next Steps

- Explore carbon reduction opportunities, including a decarbonization roadmap and sustainable building standards for development projects
- Enhance data accounting through more comprehensive collection methods and broader data coverage
- Transition to activity-based data analysis to provide more precise insights, enabling more effective sustainability management

WASTE ACTIVITIES

In the upcoming year, Main Line Health is prioritizing sustainable waste management, aligning our practices with industry-leading standards. To achieve this goal, we have developed a strategic three-step process:

1. We recently convened a comprehensive stakeholder session. This meeting brought together key representatives from across our system to identify and analyze the challenges and opportunities in our current waste management practices.
2. Continue to engage our stakeholders and team members to explore innovative approaches to enhancing our recycling and waste management practices.
3. Create tangible actions from these engagements to improve our recycling efforts and launch a pilot composting program at one of our hospital sites.

- Riddle Hospital reduced energy use by 1.6% by upgrading all of the facilities with LED lighting.
- Main Line Health participated in a demand response program, adjusting energy consumption during peak times to reduce strain on the grid. This allows for peak efficiency of HVAC systems by using predictive maintenance strategies, minimizes energy waste and helps maintain optimal indoor conditions to enhance comfort for patients and staff.



WATER EFFICIENCY PROJECTS

Main Line Health has achieved considerable progress in water conservation across its hospitals in FY25.

- Bryn Mawr Rehab Hospital exceeded expectations with a 3.7% reduction in its water use index due to proactive measures to identify and correct water inefficiencies.
- Paoli Hospital achieved a 6.5% decrease by addressing major leaks and inefficiencies.
- Mirmont Treatment Center achieved a 4.7% reduction through effective water management practices.
- Riddle Hospital saw a 1.53% reduction.



ENERGY

Main Line Health remains committed to enhancing energy efficiency and reducing carbon emissions across our facilities. In fiscal year 2025, we made significant progress:

- Bryn Mawr Rehab Hospital achieved an impressive 3.5% reduction in fiscal year 2025 in its energy use index, significantly surpassing our target. This accomplishment was due to initiatives such as refining HVAC setback controls to optimize system usage to meet specific area demands.

The use of water-efficient fixtures has been key to our success, along with implementing systems that monitor and quickly correct any inefficiencies. Regular audits and checks also helped to fix potential issues right away.

Sustainability Certifications

Main Line Health has certified more than 1 million square feet of facilities with a sustainability certification.

The system has prioritized the following principles:
