PROGRAM OVERVIEW

This program will focus on recent advances in the field of cardiovascular care, and options available for the management of patients. Clinical and practical issues that healthcare professionals encounter on a daily basis will be discussed.

TARGET AUDIENCE

The target audience is primary care physicians, clinical cardiologists, advanced practice providers, physician assistants, nurses, residents, fellows, medical students. Other members of the health care team are encouraged to attend.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

The Latest in Lipids

- Review the steps in the evaluation of hyperlipidemia.
- Outline the management options available for hyperlipidemia.
- Explain the importance of early diagnosis and treatment of hyperlipidemia

Cardiac Clearance

- Recognize the importance of a thorough pre-op evaluation for patients with heart disease
- Identify risk factors for perioperative adverse cardiac events
- Outline situations when elective surgeries should be delayed

Anticoagulation Management Pre-Procedure

- Review the current indications for antithrombotic and anticoagulation interruption in patients undergoing non-cardiac elective surgery.
- Review the basic pharmacology that can affect the homeostasis in patients undergoing non-cardiac elective surgery.
- Outline the importance of collaboration and coordination among the interprofessional team that can enhance patient care when dosing and monitoring anticoagulant drugs to improve patient outcomes for patients receiving anticoagulation undergoing non-cardiac elective surgery.

Management of Atrial Fibrillation

- Identify the etiology of atrial fibrillation
- Outline the pathophysiology of atrial fibrillation
- Summarize the treatment and management options available for atrial fibrillation

Congestive Heart Failure

- Review the pathophysiology of congestive heart failure.
- Describe the diagnostic approach to patients presenting with clinical features of congestive heart failure.
- Outline the management of congestive heart failure.
- Explain the importance of collaboration and communication among the interprofessional team to educate the patients on the importance of medication compliance to improve outcomes for those with congestive heart failure.

Thromboembolic Evaluation for Patients with VTE

- Identify the etiology of venous thromboembolism.
- Describe the appropriate diagnostic evaluation of a patient suspected to have a venous thromboembolic disease.
- Outline the current recommended guidelines for the treatment and management of venous thromboembolism.
- Summarize interprofessional team strategies for improving care coordination of venous thromboembolism.
